
M&T Bank Continues Active Involvement in Local Communities The bank succeeds when families, businesses and communities succeed

The M&T Charitable Foundation distributed approximately \$17 million in grants to hundreds of organizations across seven states and the District of Columbia in 2011. In the past decade, the bank

has donated more than \$147 million to a wide range of community-based organizations.

"Whether it's transforming neighborhoods, promoting financial and personal well-being or helping a business customer secure financing to grow, M&T is proud of its community involvement," said Mark Czarnecki, president of M&T Bank. "It is important to be part of initiatives that help strengthen the communities we serve."
