

M&T Bank contributes \$2 million to schools and programs in Pennsylvania in 2016

Includes \$90,500 to schools and agencies in Western Pennsylvania

M&T Bank has made contributions totaling \$2,108,888 to area schools and educational programs throughout Pennsylvania. The funds will provide scholarships for pre-kindergarten through 12th grade students as well as to support innovative educational programs in schools and community agencies.

The contributions are made through the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) Program, a state tax-credit program that provides a 90 percent tax credit in exchange for a 2-year commitment of funds.

Across Pennsylvania, over 140 agencies received vital funding for their programs. In the [Western Pennsylvania market](#), 13 area agencies received \$90,500 to support programs and scholarships. The decisions regarding specific agency funding are made by the regional community banking leadership.
